DISCUSSION	<p>a. Immigration School Procedures Mr. Macias walked the group through a PowerPoint presentation given to staff re: procedures when law enforcement, including ICE, come to campus.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Other than School Safety, law enforcement access to campus limited.</li> <li>• Law enforcement seeking access to campus, to students or to student records, must present a judicial warrant/subpoena issued by a court and signed by a judge as verified by TUSD Legal representatives. This does not include "warrants" created by or signed by DHS staff/agents.</li> <li>• Should ICE or other law enforcement seek access to campus beyond the front gate, staff will contact administration in chain-of-command order, starting with Mr. Macias and proceeding from there. Once an administration representative is present, they will determine the course of action, adhering to governing board policies.</li> <li>• Law enforcement cannot question students without the consent of a</li> </ul>

	<p>parent or guardian if the student is under 18; if over 18, the student must give consent.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• The exception for requiring parent/guardian consent is if law enforcement is investigating a case of child abuse or neglect.</li> <li>• At all times, staff will diligently safeguard the privacy of students, parents, and their families and will not disclose information to anyone about a student, parent or family member’s immigration status. Records or information will require a judicial warrant.</li> <li>• Should a parent/guardian of a minor child be detained by ICE or CPB, the minor child will be released to the emergency contact. If the emergency contact is unable or unwilling to retrieve the child from campus, the administration will contact DCS for further steps.</li> <li>• Staff will work to minimize disruption to campus activities by granting law enforcement with a verified judicial warrant or subpoena access to a private space to conduct interviews/questioning under the scope of the warrant, up to and including implementing lockdown procedures (especially if a group of armed agents is near/on campus).</li> <li>• ICE/CPB activity will be limited to the scope of their warrant and will not be allowed to enter campus to conduct “sweeps” for undocumented individuals.</li> <li>• These policies/procedures apply to all school-sanctioned activities on or off campus, including field trips.</li> <li>• Though TUSD adheres to state law limiting cell phone use by students during instructional time, staff will prioritize other policies to ensure student safety and students will be allowed to video or audio record law enforcement activity on campus unless it involves an individual student, in which case staff will do their best to limit recording as to protect the privacy of that student.</li> <li>• The district website has links to Governing Board Policies as well as to resources for families who might need support related to immigration.</li> <li>• Mr. Macias is working with TAP staff to develop a student-friendly version of the district presentation.</li> <li>• Questions about this policy can be addressed to Mr. Macias.</li> </ul> <p>b.
